

## Edmonds Spring Fest — Vendor Load-In Instructions

### Arrival & Check-In

All vendors (except food trucks and walk-ins) enter from **Dayton Street**. Look for our flag marked “CHECK IN” — Kristen will greet you and direct you to your booth. We recommend downloading the map and noting your booth number before you arrive.

### Load-In

The flow is the same for everyone: **pull over in the right lane (regardless of which side your actual booth is on), unload, drive in the left lane, then exit left toward Main St.** Find your booth below to know which aisle to use:

Route	Aisle	Booths
Aisle A	Drive up the center aisle	1–8, 35–48, 75–88, 101–112, 119–124
Aisle B	Go around the baseball diamond, then up the aisle between booths 68 & 69	9–14, 29–34, 49–54, 69–74, 89–94, 95–100, 113–118
Aisle C	Go around the baseball diamond, then up the aisle between the booths and food trucks	15–21, 22–28, 55–61, 62–68

**⚠ No driving on the baseball diamond — violators will be fined.**

### Load-Out

Load-out follows the same process. Begin by packing up your booth BEFORE retrieving your car. Because we will all be loading out at the same time, it is crucial that everyone adheres to these rules to prevent having too many cars on the field at once, and/or long trafficky bottlenecks at the gate. **If we see that you have brought your car onto the field and are still packing up your booth, we will ask you to move your car.** Return to **Dayton Street**, follow your same aisle route, and exit toward **Main St.** Coming prepared and knowing your route in advance helps keep the line moving for everyone.

### A Note from Our Team

We are so excited to have you with us this weekend! We know setup can feel hectic — we’re working just as hard behind the scenes to make this a great day for everyone. With over 100 vendors to coordinate, even small delays can ripple down the line, so coming prepared and following the instructions above goes a long way.

If you find yourself waiting on the street, hang tight — we’re moving as fast as we can. Once you’re in the field, please drive slowly. There will be lots of kids and dogs around, and keeping everyone safe is our top priority.

Our staff genuinely want to see you succeed this weekend. A little patience and kindness goes a long way — and we promise to give you the same in return.
